Gary is a roofer from Des Moines, Iowa who travelled to a remote hillside above Kilbite, Haiti to build a new porch for some much-needed shade for Grandma Adeline and her handicapped granddaughter.

Why? Like His Lord, Gary came to Haiti to serve.

Gary immediately saw the value of his work when he saw the hot and bleak conditions where Girl Adeline had no options but to stay. This was a real life-changer for both Girl Adeline and her grandmother. Gary jumped right in to minister with T-fre and Jimmy, our maintenance team.

Girl Adeline is 15. She can communicate but she cannot speak. She cannot walk, feed herself and is incontinent. Grandma Adeline has cared for her all her life. Caring for Girl Adeline is a heavy responsibility that requires continual patience and love. Because their house is cramped and very hot, we decided to build a shady porch where Girl Adeline can spend her days.

A wise old monk once said, "Always be prepared to preach the gospel, and if necessary - use words."

Gary's willingness to leave the comforts of his home and create a better life for the poor remind me of Christ's incarnation - His willingness to leave heaven to come to sacrifice and serve. Also, seeing Grandma Adeline's faithfulness is inspiring.

God's Spirit working through Gary and Adeline demonstrate the kind of love that God's Kingdom is built upon - sacrifices steeped in compassion. What a delight to see joyful servants living out lives that reflect the gospel of Christ! Amen!

Last month two Bible teachers, David Way and Pastor Michael Mudlaff, travelled to our village of Kilbitè, to The Church of the God of Perfection, to train a dozen leaders and local pastors. All to better understand, teach, and apply the Scriptures.

Michael and David did more than feed. They taught these leaders to fish. And in turn these leaders were equipped to pass on to others how to understand and apply the Word of God.

The book of Jonah was used to teach about God and how to effectively communicate His Word. Each pastor was given a pre-assignment and was able to implement many new skills using the Pathways curriculum. All our material was written for them in Creole.

Pathways trainers (pathwaytrainers.com) travel worldwide to equip pastors with sound methods to discern and convey the message of God's Word. Pastor Michael taught Pathways training in both India and Romania before volunteering this time in Haiti. This was David's first official Pathway's training. Immediately before leaving for Haiti, David and I attended a Pathways training workshop in Des Moines. Essential to the teaching was Pastor Ostanel, long-time friend and ministry partner who did an outstanding job translating.

David is well versed in Creole. The pastors appreciated David's enthusiasm and liked hearing him teach in their own language. It was a blast watching and hearing David preach some essential skills in his best French/Creole accent. I say it - you say it! "Ob - zer - va - syon! App - lee - kay - syon!" A common question... "Kisa teks la di?" (What does the text say?) What a delight to see the faces of teachers and students light up when principles and concepts were understood.

God's Mercy to Haiti is about seeing the Kingdom of God expanded. Inherent in seeing the Kingdom of God grow is duplication. This is also foundational in the Pathway's curriculum. The pastors said the training was practical and beneficial and were eager for more.

We are forever grateful to the Holy Spirit for giving us eyes to see and ears to hear God speak through His Word!
