Our ladies prepared over 400 meals for the village (over 1000 chicken legs). All cooking over charcoal! They stayed up the night before preparing. During the service they switched between cooking, singing special worship songs, then back to serving. Amazing! Their hearts are devoted to care for their church and village. God's Spirit is indeed upon them!

Eight years ago, 40 spiritual pioneers trekked up the hillside above Kilbitè to establish a spiritual outpost. A new church for their impoverished village. A miracle out of nowhere? Not hardly. God's fight for Kilbitè is both strategic and intentional. It is because of God's hand that this testimony of The Church of the God of Perfection be proclaimed.

We are not finished. This fight continues. To announce His grace to those who oppose Him. Refuge for all who seek Him. A fight for mercy. For redemption. For righteousness. For His Kingdom. For the glory of His Name.

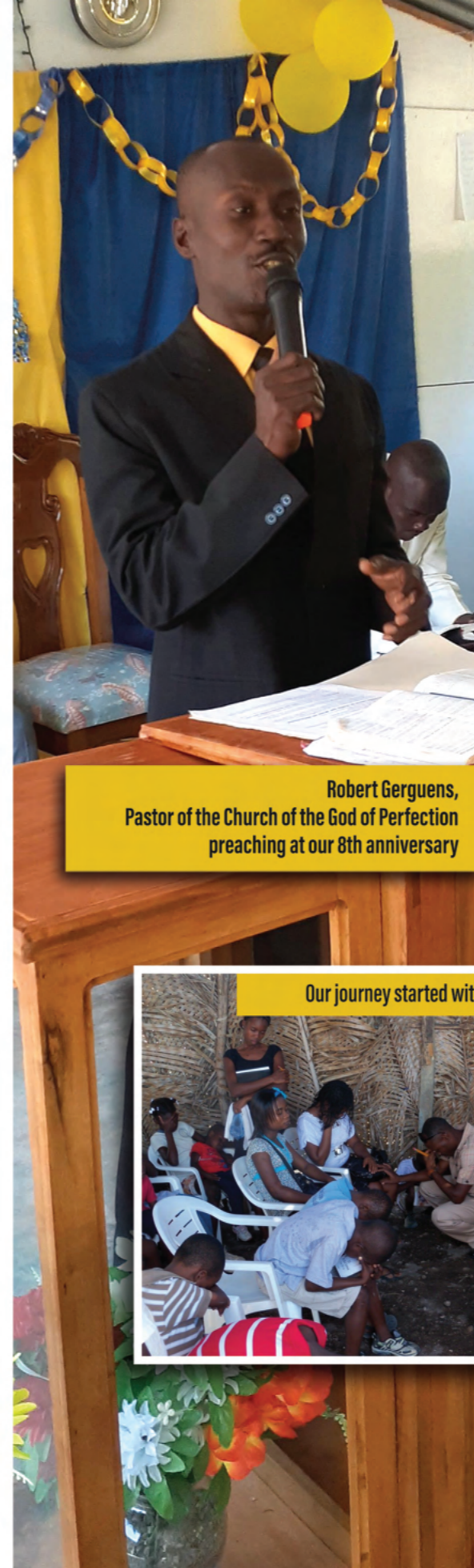

Our journey started with prayer and worship

Dear Friends,

True Christianity is a fight.
That's because it's worth fighting for.

Eight years ago, The Church of the God of Perfection was birthed on a mission field ripe for spiritual battles.

Voodoo has generational strangleholds in the Haitian culture. When I asked about placing a cross on our first church building, the people laughed and said, "No, that would be Voodoo." Voodoo has ruled the culture in Kilbitè. It's bold in its deceptions. It stands opposed to Christ.

But The Church of the God of Perfection has engaged in this spiritual fight. Our message is Christ and the power of His gospel. We counter the voodoo culture by establishing a "Kingdom" culture. We are winning this fight.

After eight years, the tide has turned. And there is no turning back!

In January we celebrated our church's 8th anniversary. As leaders, we wanted to celebrate the growth God gave our church. So, Deacons Yonel and Guinel, and Pastor Gerguens and I honored God with a spiritual marker displaying His love. The cross.

It's a 20-foot-tall illuminated white Christian cross on top of our church building. This is our declaration of spiritual victory. Our spiritual Iwo Jima. In His cross we proclaim God's redemption and hope!

On the way to install our new Christian cross, God affirmed His hand in this fight. For decades, a 6-foot wooden voodoo cross was a fixture in Kilbitè. It was considered sacred. No one would dare touch it. It stood planted in the ground next to an enormous, generations old, mango tree. On this day, God gave that mango tree a divine nudge.

He toppled that mango tree and crushed that wooden voodoo cross!

No storms. No wind. No help from men. Just God.

There it laid. Looking all pitiful, pinned under the huge tree. This amazing wonder had the village buzzing. Èske ou wè sa Bondye te fè? (Did you see what God did?)

It was glorious! When I saw it I began singing and praising God. Many villagers joined in. The voodoo priestess who lives a stone's throw away was glaring at me in defeat. She understood this moment. We all did. (Photos of this are in the center section).

This day, the cross of deception was crushed. And the cross of Redemption was lifted high! This is a strategic victory for the Kingdom of God.

What makes all this especially sweet is the Scripture that was preached just the evening before... *And having disarmed the powers and authorities, He (Christ) made a public spectacle of them, triumphing over them by the cross. (Col 2:15)*

A public spectacle indeed! In both the spiritual and physical realms.

Rejoice with us! We give thanks and honor God! He gives Kilbitè victory through our Lord Jesus Christ!

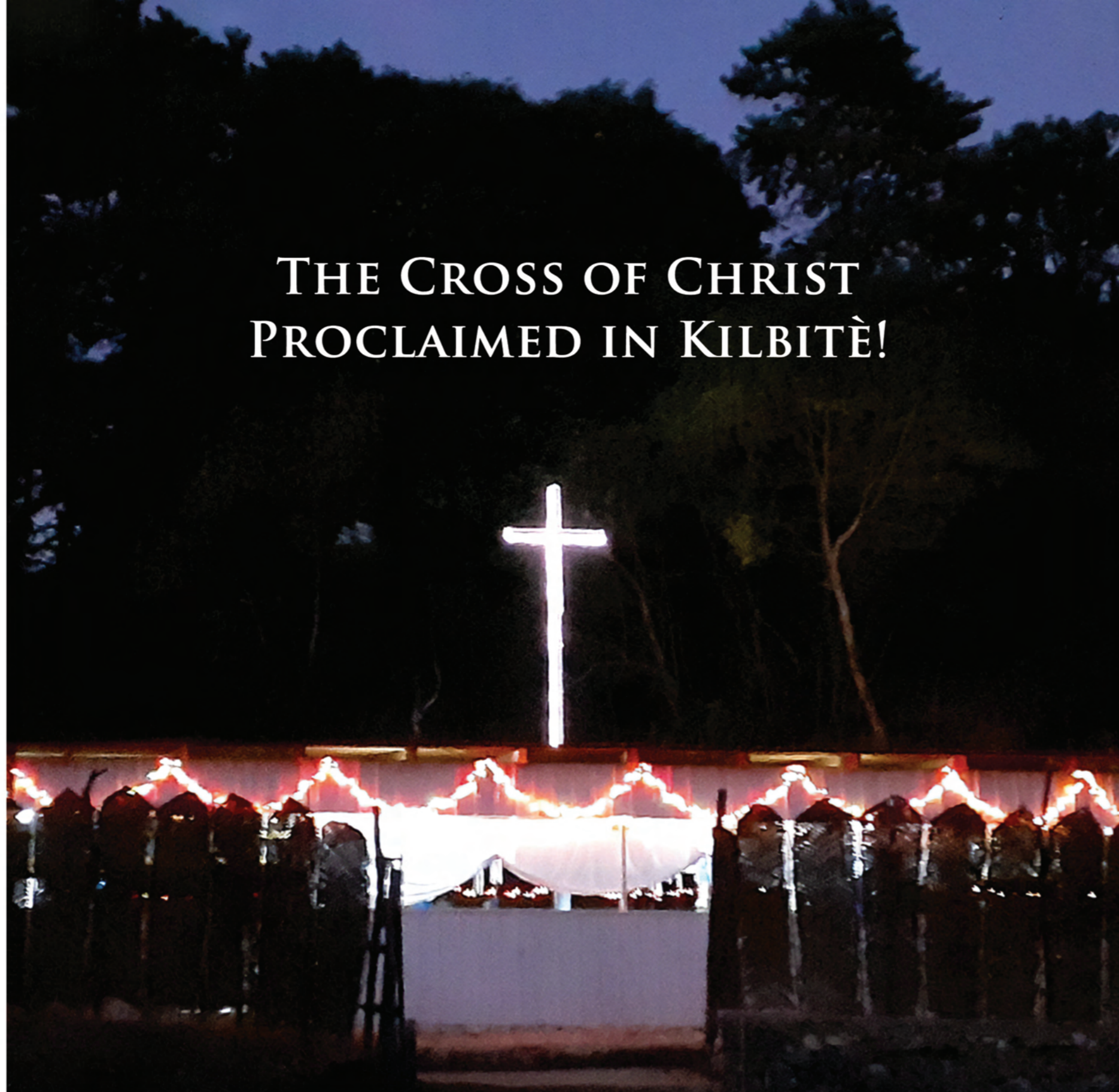
