Dear Friends,

Humility matters.

The secret to developing a fruitful ministry is to surround yourself with broken (humble) people. For God increases His Kingdom through the "least" of these.

Starting something in Haiti in one thing. Maintaining it is another story. Buildings don't fix themselves. Ministries need leadership.

Last month I wore a few different hats. The school and church buildings were painted. We built forms and poured a set of concrete steps for the church. Our summer feeding program needed leadership.

I love projects. But it's easy for me to forget God didn't just send me overseas to minister to Haitians *-but for Him to minister to me.*

After a day of running the paint sprayer I was layered in several coats of beautiful blue oil-based paint. I had no idea my face resembled a smurf. At day's end, a wonderful elderly saint, Madam Wilfred, approached me. Without saying a word, she soaked a coarse rag in paint thinner and began scrubbing the paint off my feet. I wept as she proceeded to wipe the paint from my beard and face.

I was humbled to the point of tears.

Leaving Haiti on the way to the airport we were stuck in traffic (a dangerous place to be). A young man approached our vehicle with a towel and cleaned it. Afterwards he asked for a tip. Our windows were up. He pounded on the vehicle and pleaded, "Give me 10 gouds! Give me 10 gouds!" He was asking for 10 cents! A dime! I was broken by his bold desperation.

It was in these acts of humility and desperation I saw Jesus. He broke me with the tenderness of Madam Wilfred. He broke me again, revealing the dire need of desperate stranger.

Jesus Christ saved me many years ago through His cross of redemption. His Spirit continues His work in my soul - through the humble and disadvantaged. It is an honor to be surrounded by the "least" of His. For in them, I am not only blessed to serve my Lord, *but to see Him as well!*

I return to Haiti next month to teach and train our leaders in the church and school. It is with a spirit of humility I ask for your prayers and financial help to sustain this ministry. We are His heart and hands to the humbled and disadvantaged. God's Mercy to Haiti needs you.
