Gang extortion is part of everyday life. Gangs extort a fee for buying food, gas, even passing through town. They walk around Cabaret with automatic weapons, flashing pistols, and intimidating all. Most businesses are closed because the owners fear being kidnapped. People only go out when absolutely necessary. One Haitian told me people feel like prisoners in their own homes.

Food and famine. How will I get my next meal? This thought dominates the Haitian psyche. Thankfully the city of Arkayae is not under gang control. Our leadership team buys our food here. We are feeding 5000 meals a week in 4 different villages. We have two 4x4's and six motorcycles we use to distribute food. Our leaders and staff, while under duress, are never short of **courage and faith.**

We are grateful for every donation and are praying and working to secure more.

AARON'S STORY...

Twenty years ago I ministered to Aaron who had just been released from prison. Sunday he went to church and heard the parable of the yeast working through the dough. About God's expanding Kingdom.

To apply the lesson, everyone at church was given \$5, and like yeast, the goal was to increase the blessing. Aaron asked his mom to match the \$5 gift. And she did. Then he asked his boss to match his \$10. And he did. He kept at it and ended up with \$120.

His goal was to feed the homeless in downtown Denver. He went to McDonald's and bought cheeseburgers at 2/\$1. He loaded up 240 McDonald's burgers in large plastic bags. Got on a bus and went downtown and fed the homeless.

A blessing that started with only \$5 fed over 100 hungry people!

There are valuable lessons to be learned from scripture, and from ex-cons, and Haitians about mercy and how the Kingdom of God grows.

We pray to the Holy Spirit for more networking, cooperation, and sharing. More yeast to fight this evil in Haiti. We invite you to join us.
