Thankfully, many whom God has called have stepped up to the plate, and in the clutch, delivered hit after hit. Some sacrificed. Some singled. A few homered.

We are so grateful to God for all of you here in the US, who have shone so brightly upon our village. Every response to our plea for help is lighting up Kilbitè, and beyond! Amen!

Recently the Holy Spirit brought six souls to new faith in Christ. The Church of the God of Perfection is busting at the seams at Sunday worship. And so is our sister church in Travo. God's Word is reaching more people every day. GMH is equipping the church to feed 2500 meals per week for the next 4 months.

We have every reason to be optimistic while walking in The Light. Light will always penetrate darkness.

We humbly ask for your help to continue to feed empty stomachs and hungry souls.

THE FEW. THE PROUD.

THE VOODOO RANGERS. Haiti nurses her own demons. And voodoo is willing to oblige.

Those who have the guts to fight against such dark spiritual forces I refer to as Voodoo Rangers. Their weapons are prayer, faith, the gospel, and God's Word. God's Spirit is their driving Force. Voodoo Rangers love their enemies with mercy, forgiveness, and prayer.

Pastor Nico led a criminal life as a youth. He was consumed by alcohol by age 19. One evening three friends came to his house while he was drunk and laid hands on him and told him he belonged to Christ. Though he had never gone to a church before, a few days later he found himself at a worship service. That's when God saved Nico from himself. He's been a Voodoo Ranger ever since.

After serving in the church more than a decade Nico was 32 when he started The Redeemer's Church. His church is next to a voodoo temple in Travo in the foothills above Kilbitè. Both villages battle voodoo influence. Dirt floors and a tin roof housed his flock of Christian soldiers. Faith, perseverance, and the Holy Spirit protected and grew this congregation. In a village of about 400, over 120 people come to worship every Sunday.

Nico and his family know firsthand the cosmic powers opposed to his message of Christ and the cross. Both he and his daughters have been cursed by voodoo priests and fallen into comas for days. Only to be delivered by intercessory prayers from the congregation. Nico and his wife, Marie, were threatened to be shot and were forced to leave their tarp hut and the land they lived on. Currently, men are threatening to overtake the church's land. Nico's battles are fought in the spiritual realm.

For the past 10 years the Holy Spirit has been building bonds between God's Mercy to Haiti and Pastor Nico. He has come to our leadership seeking counsel and prayer. He attended all our pastor trainings. Together we've reached out to Kilbitè and Travo with mercy and worship.

Kilbitè and Travo are not the only places inhabited by Voodoo Rangers. There's a few in the US too.

Recently a local Voodoo Ranger from right here in Iowa, blessed God's Mercy to Haiti with a generous gift. Unselfishly, our Haitian leadership seized the opportunity by using this gift to widen our reach for God's Kingdom - to bless Pastor Nico and equip The Redeemer's Church in Travo.

Now, for the first time in over 20 years of ministry Pastor Nico will have a paycheck for the next year. The Redeemer's Church has new cooking kettles and a budget for an essential food ministry to their village. Blessing many who were on the edge of starvation. This kind of mercy and encouragement are deeply empowering.

An equipped, battle tested warrior, is an essential strategic advantage to advance God's gospel.

The few. The proud. The Voodoo Rangers. Willing to battle for the sake of the poor and the glory of their Holy Commander.

Join us in praising God... for calling, preserving, and equipping warriors for the sake of His Kingdom!


